
Delivery Method of Medicines

Give **subcutaneous** (**Sub-Q**) Injections under loose skin of neck, using the tented method.

Give Intra-muscular (IM) injections in the neck.

If label indicates a choice use **Sub-Q** (under the skin) injections over **IM**.
